Jesus' baptism is a personal experience for him. He is awakened to his fundamental identity as God's beloved and now his task is to awaken others to their identity as God's loved ones. In enabling people to realise that they are already sons and daughters of God, Jesus awakens them to the truth of their identity. Examples of this can be seen in his encounters with people such as the woman caught in adultery, Zacchaeus or the woman at the well. Using the backdrop of their own experiences, Jesus invites people to re-consider their choices and move into more life-giving ways of being. It is for this reason that Jesus must be baptised by John. It is in hearing God's voice, in being fully aware of his identity, that Jesus can enable others to hear God's voice and to preach the forgiveness of sins

<u>Annual Reminders: Mass arrangements.</u> We welcome annual Masses booked in advance for deceased members of families and admire the numbers who come from afar to remember their loved ones in prayer. We will strive to honour these arrangements except on occasions when we have a funeral on a Sunday. In that case the Mass becomes a Requiem for the deceased person. When notified of a funeral, we will immediately contact the family of the booked Mass and arrange another date acceptable to all. We also will try and give priority to Months Memory and 1st Anniversary Masses. Most families with booked Masses will understand this practice and are willing to rearrange their Masses so that a family with a recent bereavement can celebrate their Month's Memory or 1st Anniversary Mass near to the appropriate time. Sometimes families have no objection in sharing a booked Mass with other families – At times a shared Mass is necessary due to the volume of requests for anniversary Masses.

If a family requests a <u>Funeral Mass on a Sunday</u>, the Requiem will be at the time stipulated for the Sunday Mass in that church. Also, we request that the remains be taken to that church on the previous day and not immediately before the Sunday Mass. We have a heavy Mass schedule on Sundays and very often Baptisms arranged weeks in advance, so we have to be on time to respect the regular Sunday Mass goers.

Funeral Orations: We have a clear directive from the Bishop of Meath "It was decided some time ago by the Council of Priests that **no panegyrics or eulogies by relatives of the deceased take place in church**. If people wish to talk in the cemetery, they are very welcome to speak at the graveside of our loved ones. Orations by people in the church on the occasion of funerals have caused irritation to many attending the ceremony. Such speeches tend to change the nature of the funeral Mass and its purpose which is the commending of the dead person to the Lord".
