Today's Gospel: There is a crack in everything that's how the light gets in-Leonard *Cohen* No one is perfect. This might seem like the most obvious statement in the world, but it's important to remember. We live in a time when people's thoughts and actions are more widely recorded and open to scrutiny than ever before. It appears to be easier than ever to take the moral high ground, and to dismiss a person entirely based on one thing we know about them An opinion expressed, particularly online, can invite a world of insults.. This is not the way Jesus treated people, and it is not how he sees us. The Samaritan woman Jesus meets is all too aware of what the Jews think of her. She is nervous when approached by Jesus at the well. But he sees beyond the label to the person, the woman with a life story and a context of her own. He engages her in intellectual conversation, listens to her, and wins her over. Jesus could tell the woman everything about her life, and he knows each one of us just as intimately. He knows our past and our faults, our 'cracks'. That is why he is able to speak to us, if we resolve to try and listen. It is also an important lesson in how we should treat others.

Trocaire - Lenten Campaign 2023 This Lent we learn about Somalia, how conflict and climate change have led to an unprecedented food crisis in an already vulnerable part of the world. 5 years with no rain have led to drought and the death of livestock on which so many Somalis depend for food and income. We learn how Trócaire is supporting people in Somalia through emergency food provisions, health programmes and education. We focus on the story of the Mahat family and their journey from their village to an internally displaced persons' camp in search of food. We hear of how this family remains united and hopeful despite all that has happened and how the parents

trust in a bright future for their children.

Easter Sunday: Outdoor Dawn Mass at 6am for all parishioners and **Easter Sunday** friends in unused part of Mucklagh New Cemetery at which we will be **Dawn Masses** remembering and praying for all who died since last Easter and those laid to rest in <u>all</u> our parish cemeteries.
