Today's Gospel: We live in a world today that often sees being rich and having money is better than concern for others who have less; being powerful is more important than being an ordinary worker and getting more is better than sharing and giving.. Jesus and the gospel challenges that assumption and it challenges us in our own daily lives as we strive to follow Jesus as his disciples. Someone once said that because we pray and precisely because we pray, we are to turn our attention to our brothers and sisters especially those who are need. If we call ourselves Christian and say that we are following Jesus, then this needs to be seen in the quality of ordinary lives. In our gospel, Jesus makes it clear that he is to be centre of our lives. But this does not mean that we ignore others, especially those who are in need of help. As St. Paul reminds us in the letter to the Romans, 'make hospitality your special care'. Hospitality is about how we welcome and treat others, regardless of who they are. It is about putting their needs and situation before ours. In his letter to the Hebrews Paul also tells us to always welcome strangers, for by doing this, we may be entertaining angels without knowing it. This week, may we make hospitality our special care. May we be open and ready to reach out and serve those who need our help. May the faith we believe in our hearts, profess with our lips be seen in the work of our hands and in the quality of daily lives. For whatever we do to each other, we do for Christ. Whatever we fail to do for each other, we fail to do for Christ.

The Synod that we are now celebrating calls us to become a Church that gets up, one that is not turned in on itself, but capable of pressing forward, leaving behind its own prisons and setting out to meet the world, with the courage to open doors. A Church without chains and walls, in which everyone can feel welcomed and

accompanied, one where listening, dialogue and participation are cultivated under the sole authority of the Holy Spirit. The Church that is free and humble, that "gets up quickly" and does not temporize or dilly-dally before the challenges of the present time. A Church that does not linger in its sacred precincts, but is driven by enthusiasm for the preaching of the Gospel and the desire to encounter and accept everyone. Let us not forget that word: everyone. Everyone! Go to crossroads and bring everyone, the blind, the deaf, the lame, the sick, the righteous and the sinner: everyone! This word of the Lord should continue to echo in our hearts and minds: in the Church there is a place for everyone. Many times, we become a Church with doors open, but only for sending people away, for condemning people. Yesterday one of you said to me "This is no time for the Church to be sending away, it is the time to welcome". "They did not come to the banquet..." – so go to the crossroads. Bring everyone, everyone! "But they are sinners..." – Everyone! [Pope Francis–Homily 29 June 2022]
