Today's Gospel - God's Building: Why is Jesus angry? Religion has come down to ritual, and the center is missing. The falsity of the occasion was the using of the temple to be entrapped by riches. The poor were being overcharged to pay for the materials for sacrifices. This caused the anger of Jesus. The temple has disap-

peared now. We are God's building. Only if God is alive in us all the time, will he be alive in the building. If God is not alive all week in us, God will not be alive on Sunday. If he is not alive in our hearts – well, maybe that's sometimes why religion can be so devoid of joy and energy. It's religion only from the neck up. The forty six years are over, and the three days of the rebuilding have been going on for years, in the hearts of all who are faithful to God's love. The building continues still and we are the living stones. Think of what is most central to your life. Lord, keep me close to all you love and value in life...

Lent - Springtime of the Spirit: Each year, the trees give us a lesson in renewal. First the bud, then the blossom and finally the shoot. Spring dresses the trees in a new robe and makes them young again. But this is possible only because in autumn, they let go of their old leaves and in between, endured a period of nakedness and vulnerability. Lent is the springtime of the Spirit. Lord, help us not to be afraid to let go of old habits and to face our spiritual poverty in order that you may renew us and so, at Easter we will feel young again in our discipleship

Lord Jesus, when I am in pain help me to think of you being nailed to the cross. Lord Jesus, when I am dying Help me to think of you dying on the cross for love of me. Lord Jesus, help me to remember how you suffered for love of me and help me to love you and others more and more
