

He calls us in our uniqueness with our very particular temperament, our unique identity, the background that is specific to each one of us. No one

of us is like anyone else. From the time of our baptism, we are each called to be the Lord's disciples, to follow the good Shepherd. However, the particular way in which the Lord works through us is unique to each one of us. I can do something for the Lord that only I can do. Each one of us has a unique contribution to make to the work of the Lord in the world and in the life of the church. That contribution is just as vital as anyone else's contribution. Each one of us is vitally important to the Lord. The first reading talks about the stone that was rejected by the builders becoming the keystone of the building. There is a clear reference there to Jesus himself, the rejected one. We can all feel at times like the rejected stone, for whatever reason. Yet, we are never rejected in the Lord's eyes. He continues to call us in the way that is unique to us. He sees us as the keystone for some aspect of his work. He recognizes the potential for good that is within us all. Pope Francis recently met with a group of 200 children at a parish in Rome. Responding to the children's questions, he offered a brief catechesis on the topic of the prayer of thanksgiving. "It's important to give thanks for everything. For example, if you enter a person's house and don't say thank you, or don't say hello, is that good? The first word is

'thank you,' and the second is 'please he told the children "The third word is 'forgiveness,' Is a person who never asks for forgiveness good? It's difficult to ask for forgiveness, sometimes shame and pride go with it. But it's important to say I'm sorry a lot Next, Pope Francis asked the children: "But do you pray? How do you pray? What can you say to the Lord?" One of the children said that he and his family pray before eating. Pope Francis then continued But do you know that there are so many children who don't have food? Do I thank the Lord for giving me food? Do I thank you for giving me a family?" he asked. The last question touched on the topic of faith. "But are you Christians?" Pope Francis asked. "Do you have faith? Let's say it together. Thank you, Lord, for giving me faith." During the exchange, one of the children's most emotional questions was from a 10-year-old named Alice: "How can I thank the Lord in my illness?" Even in dark moments, we have to thank the Lord, because he gives us the patience to tolerate difficulties. Let's say it together: Thank you, Lord, for giving us the strength to tolerate pain," the pontiff said. Darkness into Light 11th May 2024: We are planning to organize a walk on the
