Todays Gospel Both the Pharisee and the tax collector went to the Temple to pray. The difference between the two was not in their words alone but mostly found in their hearts. Like the tax collector we are invited to come before God with honesty and openness, not seeking to impress God with fancy words or long speeches, but simply, speaking from the heart whether we are joyful or broken, confident or confused. Unlike the Pharisee, we are to avoid comparing ourselves to others, either for better or worse, recognising instead that God sees and hears each of us individually, and attends to us with love and mercy when we are faithful to that which God asks of us – and when we get it wrong. When we approach God in prayer with humility God listens attentively. So let our prayer be that of the tax collector – 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner' – prayed with humility and integrity, confident that such a prayer with indeed pierce the clouds and reach the very heart of God
