The Future of our Parishes: Communities of Belonging and Evangelisation" **Bishop Tom Deenihan writes** Many of the concerns and views expressed in the recent synodal discussions across the Diocese of Meath underscored the importance of Parish as an expression of the faith community. People wished to see a greater sense of community in their parish, many wished for greater involvement in their parish and most expressed concern for the future of their parish in terms of faith practice and the availability of clergy in the Diocese. Handing on the faith to the next generation was also a major concern. These concerns are shared by all of us and have also been discussed over the past few years by the priests of the Diocese. With a view to strengthening parish identity, I mandated Parish Pastoral Councils for all parishes in the Diocese three years ago and Fr. Derek Darby, as Episcopal Vicar for Pastoral Development, has been working with all parish councils in terms of providing in-service and training. Ms. Elaine Campbell, Director for Faith Development, has begun to work with these councils to promote faith development initiatives. I have also met with representatives of those councils twice over the past two years to discuss their concerns about the future of parishes in the diocese. The only focus of these parish councils is the work of evangelisation & supporting the pastoral mission of the Church in their own parish Such work builds and supports the local faith community.

Yang of Glory Today's Gospel Christ the King Today's Preface describes Christ's kingdom as one of truth and life, of holiness and grace, of justice. love and peace. This ideal is not to be merely a future hope but is to be worked for in the present. The kingdom is our hope, but somehow it is also in our midst in the process of becoming. we are to promote the fuller coming of God's kingdom among us. It comes whenever justice is done for the hungry, the thirsty, the naked, and the oppressed. To behave in this way is to imitate the Shepherd-King himself who is presented in our Gospels as one who rescues from situations of alienation, who feeds, gives rest, heals and makes strong The way to serve Christ our King is to work for the coming of his kingdom. In working for the relief of the deprived, the oppressed and the outcast we are serving Christ in person, because Jesus identifies himself with all those in need, personally. Therefore a disciple of Christ the King cannot afford the comfortable luxury of merely shrugging at life's injustices. "I just keep myself to myself" or "Anyway, I do nobody any harm" are not neutral stances; they are refusals to get involved. To be deaf to the cries of the neighbour in need is to be deaf to Christ. To be blind to the anguish of the dying is to close our eyes to Christ. Taking Jesus as our Shepherd-king involves becoming shepherds in some way ourselves for his work of justice & salvation goes on.
